As the owner and operator of eleven airports located across a large geographical area covering the Scottish Highlands and Islands and Tayside, we are committed to minimising our impact on the environment. We also understand the positive role that our airports play in local communities, operating lifeline services and providing social and economic benefits.

Our impacts and responsibilities extend beyond the physical boundaries of our airports. Where we do not have direct control over operational emissions, such as aircraft movements and passenger surface access, we will work in partnership with our operators and the wider industry to improve performance and help shape government policies where we are able to do so.

- understanding our environmental impacts and implementing measures to reduce negative impacts and maximise positive opportunities
- prevent and reduce pollution, working with our third parties and following established principals, including 'Polluter Pays'
- working with our stakeholders to identify partnership opportunities to reduce negative impacts, improve our performance and contribute to shared social and economic benefits
- maintaining an environmental management system, allowing us to continually monitor, review and improve our performance
- communicating our performance internally and externally in an open and transparent way

The strategy will be supported by a 10-year road map to help us deliver our sustainability priorities and objectives will be set annually.
